The oldest park in Toronto and the centre of our renowned Heritage District needs a facelift. The tarmac on the pathways needs to be replaced. **Cabbagetown Art & Crafts**, the organization that runs the art and craft sale in the park during the Festival each fall, has generously donated \$5,000 to the City of Toronto to get the pathways paved as concrete sidewalks. The solid line indicates an 8X8" block; the dotted line indicates a 4X8" block. Try pencilling your letters in the space roughly the size and spacing you want. The only typeface available is a plain, non-serif typeface like this one. Letters will be made as large as possible, so the fewer the letters, the larger the type. Small letters tend to wear more quickly than large ones but if you wish, you may put more lines on the stone than the two or four recommended. You will be contacted if there are problems. This side is just for practice; we will take your dedication from the other side.
